I write in support of *Going Beyond Green: Cultivating Community, Connections, and Crops*, the Sacramento Metropolitan Air Quality Management District's (Sac Metro Air District) grant application to the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency's (EPA) Climate Pollution Reduction Grants notice of funding opportunity.

Sacramento County is a strong partner throughout the development of the region's Priority Climate Action Plan, known as the Capital Region Climate Priorities Plan, and supports the implementation efforts described in the Sacramento Metro Air District's application.
