Re: Protecting America's Children by Strengthening Families Act (H.R. 9076) - Support

Dear Senators and Representatives:

Sacramento County strongly supports the bipartisan *Protecting America's Children by Strengthening Families Act* (H.R. 9076) and urges prompt floor consideration of the bill.

The *Protecting America's Children by Strengthening Families Act* provides additional federal funding and flexibility for counties serving children and their families. In 11 states representing 33.7 percent of the population of children in formal foster care in 2021, county governments are fully or partially responsible for administering the child welfare system: California, Colorado, Minnesota, New York, North Carolina, North Dakota, Nevada, Ohio, Pennsylvania, Virginia and Wisconsin. While states vary in their structure of Title IV-B, the program offers county agencies key flexibility to serve families without eligibility requirements with a two-thirds federal match. At just over \$700 million annually, Title IV-B lacks sufficient funding to reach its full potential. H.R. 9076 would make several updates to Title IV-B that improve the child welfare system.
